

The photographer was cancelled and the wedding invitations put in a drawer. But then we have the first of many angelic interventions that occur in Matthew's birth narrative, and Joseph is assured that the real 'father' is the Holy Spirit. Relief all round. The wedding is back on. Interestingly, in an age when belief in God is under strain in Western Europe, belief in angels isn't. From Robbie Williams' charttopping song to the plethora of books, films and gifts featuring angels, these heavenly messengers can be well pleased with their public profile. What it

with some bemusement, unsure whether to welcome something so un-modern. But the irrepressible nature of divinity is surely something to celebrate. God uses messengers in many forms to bring us his wisdom. Which of us has not been conscious of God's authority in the words of a friend, or which of us has not woken up with a profound conviction about some course of action we were exercised about the previous night? God has his ways, and 'angels' still seem to be one of them.

Can we be open and ready for such a visitation, even today?"

I think that this can give us something to think about particularly at this time of year, so let's all look out for those angels.

FLOOD PREPARATION ADVICE FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL

If your home is at risk of flooding after heavy rainfall, you may wish to be prepared as we head towards winter.

Payhembury Parish Council has filled sand bags for use by Parishioners. These are kept at Slade Barton, and so are central in the village for collection. If you require sand bags, please

contact the clerk in the first instance on <u>01404 850094</u>. Contact details of Parish Councillors and the clerk are available in the Parish Paper each month.

In order to be prepared, the Environment Agency website is extremely useful in searching for local flood information. Simply put in your postcode and it will inform you of any risk from river flooding. Alternatively, the Floodline can be contacted on <u>0845 988 1188</u>.

The Environment Agency website also gives advice about preparing your property against flooding. More can be found on <u>www.environment-agency.gov.uk</u>



Nature Notes Observations from September

Hello again—Here's a grisly story (true)

The other day, I left my house by the front door, and noticed a big bird in Nan Underhill's drive. Actually, it turned out to be two birds, one quite alive and the other not quite alive! A female sparrow hawk had caught a pigeon, and was sitting on top of it, pecking away. It saw me coming, but refused to move initially. As I drew closer, the hawk flew away, but straight into Nan's window. It recovered, and flew into the willow tree. When I returned



to the scene, about ten minutes later, the hawk was back, continuing to feed. Half an hour later, it had gone, and had left the corpse behind, presumably having eaten its fill! Nature in the raw, eh?

Our winter visitors are back. Yes, a large posse of fieldfares have arrived on time from Scandinavia. Many more will come here soon, and fill the apple trees in Angus's orchard. These are big colourful thrushes, which come every Winter, and make their chak-chak call as they fly over. I haven't seen their smaller cousins, the redwings yet. We don't get as many of them here.



On the river Exe estuary, the winter visitors have also arrived. Thousands of wading birds, wild ducks and wild geese are already there. They have come from Iceland and Russia. The Exe is an internationally important area for these birds.

I strongly recommend to anyone interested in birds, particu-

larly wetland birds, to take a trip on the Birdwatching boat, which travels from Exmouth Dock up to Topsham. There are two boats---one is the Stuart Line and the other the RSPB boat. Both are excellent trips.

Apologies for missing the October edition, travels away made it difficult. For this month I give the statistics for September and October, and November will be in the next edition.

Rainfall: September was just below average rainfall but the deluge came in October and has continued into November so now things are similar to last Autumn when the water pours off the fields in heavy rain. The thunderstorm on 20^{th} October knocked out the telephone lines and internet routers of many in the village.

Temperatures: Both September and October have been well above average with October over 2C warmer and no sign of frosts until 13th November. As a result the Autumn tree colours were not as vivid this year. The warm Autumn is in contrast to the cold Spring of 2013. Records were broken for the maximum temperature on 3rd September and highest minimum on 3rd October.



Weather elsewhere: The amber warning from the Met Office of St Jude's storm on 28th October was given 5 days ahead which was before it had even formed over the Atlantic. It turned out to be more severe in the East of England and Denmark with a "sting jet" producing strong gusts at the surface. Since then Typhoon Haiyan, one of the strongest typhoons ever seen, has wreaked havoc in the Philippines with gusts of up to 75m/s.



Wearing a poppy on Remembrance Day.


We thank all the soldiers for being brave and strong,
