

*Nature Notes*  
*Observations from June*

Hello everyone

I'm writing these notes on 18th July. The weather is still very poor for "Summer", and this has badly affected nature around here. We should be seeing wild flowers and butterflies at this time of year, but the incessant rain has put paid to that. I did see a few butterflies up the lane the other day---speckled woods and gatekeepers---but nowhere near the normal numbers.



**Speckled Wood**

July is the start of the quiet period for birds, when they lie low because they are moulting, ie. changing their feathers. Birds will now rest for a couple of months, until they have their new plumage. There are young birds about, and these are not as brightly coloured as their parents.



**Campion**

On one of the better days, I did see some wild flowers up the lane. The wild roses were doing well until they got battered by the storms. Some campion were still in flower, and what I call "scrambled egg flowers" are blooming. Can someone please tell me their proper name? Whitethroats were heard but not seen, as usual with them! At Blue Anchor, lots of martins and swallows above, making quite a racket. What was causing this? Yes, there he was, a sparrowhawk being mobbed by about twenty "hirundines". Talking of raptors, I often see a kestrel in the Haskins Cross area, hovering or sitting on a post.

We used to see little owls around Payhembury quite regularly. I've seen them at Cokesputt, Haskins Farm, and Shutes Barn. The Garveys tell me that they used to have them at Leyhill. They are not as common these days, but Joyce Cocker saw one at Shutes Barn the other day, so all is not lost! Joyce also saw a red kite near Plymtree. Hopefully, these magnificent birds may be on the increase here.

## PARKING ON BEND NEAR SHOP

The problem of parking on the road between the Parish Hall and the corner by the shop and potential accidents was discussed at the recent Parish Council meeting. Unfortunately the highways say a pavement alongside the barn is not possible, yellow lines would take a very long time to organise (if they were possible) and the council did not feel lines would help, so it was agreed that the best way forward is for people to be responsible and think about where they park.

So whether you are going to the shop, picking children up from pre school etc or visiting near that area - PLEASE

- ◆ use the Parish Hall car park whenever possible
- ◆ NEVER park opposite a car already on the opposite side of the road
- ◆ do NOT park too close to the bend - preferably up as near to the Parish Hall gate as possible

No-one wants an accident and considering how many people cross the road near the bend to access the shop (many of them children) we must all be vigilant in our parking.

## Charity Knitting

For the last nine years, Innocent Drinks have been helping Age UK to raise money by paying 25p to Age UK for every small hat knitted, to be put on their Smoothie drinks bottles in the run up to Christmas. The hats are very simple and quick to knit and I am happy to collect any knitted to take to the Age UK office in Tiverton by the beginning of October. The basic pattern is as follows:



Use double knitting wool and size 4mm (number 8) needles.

- ◆ Cast on 28 stitches. Knit 2 rows in garter stitch or rib. Knit 12 rows in stocking stitch
- ◆ Next row - K2 tog to end of row
- ◆ Next row - P2 tog to end of row
- ◆ Break off wool, thread through stitches on needle and sew up.

Simple—use up all your odd bits of wool!

### Payhembury Parish Council

Draft minutes of Parish Council Meeting, held on Wed 11<sup>th</sup> July 2012  
(Subject to confirmation at next meeting)

The council welcomed Clare Doble as the new co-opted Councillor. With some interest in the clerk vacancy it is hoped that an appointment will be made soon.

Public session – following the announcement that the Department for Work and Pensions will be passing the administration of the Council Tax Benefit to local District Councils, Sue Derbyshire asked Cllr Skinner how the District Council will co-ordinate the proposed consultation to be held in August.

District Councillor's Report – The Local Development Plan will be going to committee on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> July. As the economic squeeze continues, more job losses are likely.

**Cuts and savings are still necessary and inevitable in the Council's finance planning.**

Matters arising - Bus to Taunton – Following a request to the Transport Co-ordination Service at Devon County Council for an existing route to Taunton to be extended to stop at Payhembury, the Clerk was informed that no adjustments could be made because this would be disruptive and that a withdrawal of funding made it impossible to create new services. The Parish Council decided to take no further action at this time.

Tennis Court Update – The Tennis Club and local residents are very happy with the improvements. There is about £1,500 left of the section 106 money that EDDC is

holding to benefit sport facilities in the village, which can go towards the multi-sport climbing wall.

Notice board - The new notice board should be completed on 14<sup>th</sup> July.

Model Code of Conduct – on the advice of Cllr Skinner the council agreed to formally adopt the code supplied by EDDC or the National Association of Local Councils as soon as possible and by the next Parish Council Meeting in September.

Playing Field S106 funding – Cllr Doble agreed to head up a working party to drive the development of the play facilities in the playing field.

Parking at the shop and road safety – The Council is aware of the danger to all road users due to thoughtless parking on the corner outside the shop & the Clerk will ask PCSO Anning to patrol the area & speak to the culprits. Cllr Williams expressed concern at the number of vehicles passing through Barrow Road & potential for more problems with access and road width if there were any development on the road.

Apologies for missing the July edition of the paper but holidays intervened. Unusually I include the May and June complete monthly averages in the table below. I have also started to include a section on sunshine based on my solar cell output.

Rainfall: Looking back at my last report in June all the talk was of drought! Well how a month can change the weather. The contrast is clear with 53% of normal rain in May and 281% of normal rain in June! The wet weather has continued with a vengeance into July with 91mm already recorded up to 14<sup>th</sup> and 37mm fell on 7 July, a record since my measurements began. As I write it looks as if the end of July may go into a drier period just in time for the Olympics. My BBQ has been hiding in the garage this summer.

Temperatures: May was a very warm month with the record for highest May temperature broken on 25 May, it seems a long time ago now. June was much closer to the average although still on the warm side. July is so far heading to be cooler than average.

Sunshine: May was slightly sunnier than last year but in June we only had 77% of the sunshine we had last year and July is continuing this dull theme.  
 ather elsewhere: In contrast to the weather here, in the U.S. and Canada it has been record breaking heat and drought as they have been on the other side of the jet stream which gave us such unsettled weather in June/July.

**EXMOOR SPONSORED WALK FOR CHILDREN'S HOSPICE SOUTH WEST**

A sponsored charity walk is an ideal way to explore one of Britain's smallest national parks - Exmoor and what better time of year than September with its autumnal colours and diverse and spectacular landscape.

Children's Hospice South West is hosting the 12 mile circular walk on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> September and the charity is calling on participants to take part. Walkers will set off from Hawkridge at 9.30am and on completion will enjoy refreshments including a burger van and tea and coffee.

Children's Hospice South West provides the only hospice care in the South West for children with life-limiting conditions. Our three hospices, Little Bridge House in Devon, Charlton Farm in Somerset, and Little Harbour in Cornwall provide respite care and support for in excess of 400 families. Of these some come to us for planned respite and a rare opportunity for a break. Others will also be supported through our bereavement team after the loss of their child.

Children's Hospice South West is the only organisation in the region offering this vital service in a hospice environment and is almost entirely funded by the generosity of people in the South West.

There is no registration fee for the event but walkers are encouraged to raise sponsorship for the charity. Sponsor forms are available on registration
