

Dear Friends

As I write this Easter is well ahead, but when you get to read this Easter will be upon us and for some of you it might even have arrived by the time you get around to reading this. As we passed through those 40 days of Lent was there any difference in the previous 40 days? Perhaps you gave something up or even took on something, how did that make you feel? Often a change of routine does you good, we can get stuck in the old ways of being and even in the old ways of thinking. Spring is a good time to be developing new ideas, as buds burst into bloom and we see the various signs of new life around us. We can start to think about new activities and even new ways of thinking, in fact we could do with a bit of spring cleaning of the mind that never hurts.

Spring cleaning of the mind, whatever is that? There have been any number of studies about clearing the mind and some have found that a cluttered mind suffers more frequently from bad memory. But I wonder whether it is bad memories that clutter the mind and it's those very memories which need to be cleaned out. Perhaps it is the memory of a disagreement with someone, or an unpleasant event or a time when you went somewhere and just didn't feel comfortable. Perhaps the clutter in the mind is your own prejudices, whatever is your particular



clutter it is often good to take it out look at it and see whether you could throw it away. The clutter of negative feelings can get so bad that good feelings and memories can't surface or even find room.

One way of doing this is to reconcile yourself with the clutter or even to reconcile yourself with the negative feelings toward someone, in a way that is what the basic Christian teaching on forgiveness is all about. So perhaps this spring you might take just a few moments to do some spring cleaning of the mind and let some good positive shiny new thoughts and ideas enter a nice clean mind. If you do you may be surprised and you may just find that God's light, positive energy has been and is shining into your mind.

PAYHEMBURY SPRING BULB AND FLOWER SHOW



The 49th Open Show held last Saturday was agreed to be another success. The hall looked and smelt colourful and fragrant.

Next month facts, figures and names of winners will be in the Parish Paper. Meanwhile many thanks to everyone.



Three years in the research and making, TVCT's site-specific production contains scenes

which range from 1348 to the modern day, each happening in separate, real spaces in and around this ancient house. Researchers discovered remarkable material in the Somerset and Devon Records Offices and most scenes spring from these sources, depicting events which did, or could have happened at Leyhill.

Because audience numbers are restricted due to space limitations in some of the rooms, just 120 tickets are available on each night, 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st April. These birds have now gone from Payhembury, and are on their way to breed in Scandinavia. We had been away for a week, and before we left I put hundreds of apples out on the back lawn. On our return, there was no sight of any apples, or even any remains. Amazing! It had been extremely cold here, and the birds must have come in force, and cleaned the lot up! When we were away, we saw some interesting ducks on a frozen lakeside. There were pairs of mandarins, golden eye and pochards---all quite rare here.

In North Wales the other day, we heard birds twittering in nearby bushes. It was an unusual sound, and turned out to be from a group of goldcrests---Britain's smallest bird. I managed to get some nice photos, they were quite obliging.

Rainfall: The rainfall in E. Devon so far this year has only been about a third of normal so water shortages are likely here if we don't get some significant rain soon. January was 50% and February and the first 2 weeks in March only 30% of normal. Things are even worse further east with hosepipe bans already announced.

Temperatures: February and March overall have been warmer than average though in early February it got pretty cold for a few days with senior citizens advised to stay indoors. Meanwhile in the US record warm temperatures were recorded in several states on 14 March.

Weather elsewhere: Space weather has also been in the news recently with the largest solar storm in 5 years. The charged particles coming from the Sun, which can disrupt power grids, satellite navigation and plane routes thankfully so far have had no obvious consequences other than the Aurora Borealis being visible from the northern U.K.

Bulgar and Roasted Vegetables with Goats Cheese

250g butternut squash, cut into small cubes
2 red onions, thickly sliced
2 courgettes, cut into thin batons
5 tbsp balsamic vinegar
2 tbsp golden caster sugar
2 tbsp olive oil
150g bulgar wheat
a handful whole almonds, toasted and roughly chopped
100g goat's cheese, crumbled
basil leaves, a few to serve

1. Heat the oven to 190c/fan170c/gas5. Spread the vegetables out in a single layer in a large shallow roasting tin. Mix the vinegar, sugar and olive oil. Pour over the veg and season well. Roast for 25 minutes until golden, stirring a couple of times.
2. Prepare the bulgar following the pack instructions. Drain well and put in a bowl.
3. Tip the veg and all of their juices in with the bulgar. Sprinkle the nuts over. Toss everything together then serve with the goat's cheese and basil leaves scattered over the top.
