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## Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents,

Yesterday we had a visit from Bishop Ellison and Bishop Leonard for Melanesia. They joined us for collective worship in church and then had a tour of our school followed by question time with the children. It was a great opportunity to share between our two communities. Our family group leaders also joined me to take part in the re-dedication of the memorial at Patterson Cross where Sam Gammon read a prayer beautifully during the service. It was a real privilege to take part in such an important service.

Our netball team played fantastically at the East Devon tournament on Wednesday reaching the final in the plate group. Well done to all those children who took part.

Other parts of my week have been less joyful. Over the last few months Headteachers and Governors have been dealing with the potential cuts to our School budgets. Much of my time now is focussed on dealing with the large anticipated cuts that will be made in the next academic year and the ones to follow.

After half term I will send a more detailed explanation of the situation faced by our school but as an urgent request I would ask that you visit [www.schoolscut.org.uk](http://www.schoolscut.org.uk). This is a new website that calculates the effect of rising costs against reducing budgets for each school to show the effect by 2019/20. This site clearly suggests that Awliscombe Church of England Primary School Budget will see a reduction of £46,340 with Payhembury Church of England Primary also facing a reduction of £26,740, representing a total cut of £73,080 across the federation.

The broader picture is that 98% of schools nationally show a reduction in their budget and that Devon's reduction is a massive £35,157,274; £401 per pupil, the equivalent of 943 fewer teachers.

I appreciate that these figures are hard to understand in real terms but they will ultimately have a huge effect on the schools. The NAHT (National association of Headteachers) and the local DAPH (Devon association for Primary Headteachers) are working hard to bring this financial crisis to the government. National and local lobbying is so important at this stage; we need to get our concerns heard. Look out for my letter on finance on our return to school.

On a lighter note, I'm really looking forward to seeing everyone at the disco later on. I know all the children are really excited. What a great way to start the half term off.
