The Governing Body has reached a critical point in the school year where we will be setting the School budgets for the coming financial year, this has become an increasingly more difficult task over the last few years and this year we take into consideration what impact the new National Funding Formula will have on our schools in the future. I am sure you will hear more about this in the press as the weeks and months go on.

We are busy with the plans to increase the size of Payhembury School and ensuring that Awliscombe School will be ready for any future Ofsted visit. Our role as Governors is to support the Leadership Team to achieve these aims and objectives.

As you will be aware the School Landscape is changing rapidly and whilst the Government have removed the condition that all schools will be an Academy by 2020 this agenda has not changed. As a Governing Body we are keeping an eye out for changes that are happening in the locality and are ensuring that we keep our options as open as possible by engaging in discussions with other schools when we feel this is appropriate. If any of these discussions move beyond initial communication we of course give you further information as to what that may be.
