Dear Parents

Well key stage 2 SATs are over for another year. I really must commend the children for their superb efforts all week. It is an incredibly tiring week and the children had to really stay focused for the four days involved. For them now they will be thinking and preparing to move up to their next schools.

Well done to Rosie Morris who was invited and took part in the mini superstars' event at Kings. Picked by Mrs Little to attend the sessions, Rosie did a fantastic job; she was a real credit to the school.

The children in Years 1, 2 and 3 were really buzzing about the all-stars cricket assembly yesterday. Having looked on site the sessions are running at Feniton, Kentisbeare and Whimple. After signing up for the club the children are then sent a bag, bat, ball, water bottle, cap and a tee shirt in preparation for the club starting in June. It has a history going back 30 years when the court used to be grass. In modern times the tennis club has recently been successful in a bid to improve the facilities and surface.

People wanting to play on the court should use the booking sheets that are held at [Payhembury Provisions](#) and there is a small charge for non-members. Membership forms can also be obtained on line, at the Payhembury Village Website, printed, filled in and returned with the relevant payment in cheque form if possible made out to Payhembury Tennis Club to 9 Hillside Payhembury EX14 3HB.

Annual fees are due in April £30.00 for a family £20.00 for a couple £15.00 for a single £10.00 for a junior, OAP or student. We feel these prices are very good value as they give members free access to the court all year. And becoming a member enables the court to remain well maintained.
