Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents

I know not everyone will agree with me but I was really hoping for snow this week. The children really deserve to get to play in the snow and they have been on full alert each day that it might come by the end of the week. So this morning when I pulled back the curtains to discover no snow I was quite sad. I don't want a lot but I would love the children to get a chance to explore the excitement snow brings. For some of our youngest it would be their first time.

We are currently building a new website for our federation. It is a vital part of the schools way to communicate with the wider world but it takes a long time to construct. I am very grateful to governors for spending many hours assisting in the new site. I believe we will be swapping over to the new one soon simply because it is difficult maintaining four sites. However we will still be tweaking and improving the new one for some time. Our aim is to have a main page for the federation that will allow you to pick a school specific website; it will be easier for parents and visitors to the site to see the two schools alongside one another. I will keep you informed of the progress we are making.

Head lice are back! Can I please ask that everyone checks their hair this weekend? We have had two classes with head lice this week. The only way to get rid of them is for us all to check and treat at the same time. They are really resistant to the medication lotions but if you continue to use conditioner for at least a week you will win the battle.

I would like to inform every one of the approaching disco booked for 10th February at Payhembury Parish hall. Last year FOPS organised a disco for the two schools so this year Awliscombe PTFA are organising the disco. Our Parish hall is an ideal location for the disco so we decided to keep it here. All children, Year 6 and under are welcome. Parents can opt to stay or leave the children at the disco. There will be refreshments to cater for everyone. I know the children love a disco and it is great to get the two schools together again. It will start at 6pm, finishing at 8pm.

We are sending a letter home to explain a new project we are hoping you will get involved with. We are taking part in Readathon. It is a fund raising opportunity to support our local children's hospital. We will receive 20% of the money raised as vouchers to buy books for the library and the

rest will go to buy new books for children in hospital. There is a super website which is worth a visit; it has video clips and resources to support your reading adventure.

All our staff went to Honiton Hospital on Thursday evening for their staff training. The focus was on speech and language therapy and different strategies that can be used to support learners in the classroom. I thought it would be of interest to know that we meet weekly to focus on continuous professional development. We look at all different aspects of teaching and learning.

On Wednesday we had a visit from Julie Paddick, Early Years advisor, to monitor and support our current Early Year's provision. It was a really useful day. Julie was very impressed with the huge progress being made in Willow. The learning environment inside and out is outstanding and the children are clearly very happy and making real progress. Well done to Mrs Palmer and her team. Mrs George and the preschool looked like they have always been part of the class and it's a joy to see.

Next Thursday is a census day. Our funding for school meals will be worked out based on the number of children on universal school meals (reception, year 1 and year 2) taken up on the 19th. It seems a very strange way to work out the funding but it means so much to our school to receive the full funding possible. I would request everyone eligible to a school dinner take one on that day. I know they have changed the menu to make it even more appealing. Thank you in advance for your support.

Also next Thursday there is a FOPS meeting in school at 3.45pm. Everyone is welcome so please come along and give your support.

Other than that it seems it will be a very quiet week next week. I have heard another cold snap is on its way so fingers crossed we have a sprinkling of snow sometime.

Finally it's great to see Mrs Foulds back today. It has been very quiet this week while she has been poorly. I know the breakfast club and after school club have really missed her.
