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## Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents

Welcome back to school after a lovely Easter holiday. I think the weather was quite good and everyone seems to have returned more relaxed. It did seem a little strange only just celebrating Easter at the end of the holiday instead of the beginning but it's good to be back.

I love the summer term as the children just love being on the field and then having lunches outdoors.

This term does look extremely busy especially with the approaching building works. I am going to offer a brief parent meeting to give you a full explanation of the plans this term to work around the build programme. I am waiting for my contractors to be confirmed and I will send the date of the meeting very soon. I will be working with everyone concerned to ensure that the disruption to the children's learning is as limited as possible but obviously we will have to make some compromises.

I am sending all the wellington boots home today as we need to begin to make space and empty the shelter area. If you don't have any boots sent home today please come and have a look under the shelter as there will be a variety of unknown/unnamed pairs left.

I would like to confirm one change I have already had to make in regards to the term dates for September 2017. The build programme is running very close to the end of the holidays and to ensure we have enough time to set the classes up I have had authority to amend our published dates to accommodate the new build. School starts for the children on Thursday 7th September now. We have added two additional days to the end of the holidays but we need to now work them at the end of the year. ### **Governors**

On Wednesday we had a full governing body meeting of which we have 5 per year. These meetings have to be carefully structured as there is always so much to cover in a short space of time, but we are lucky enough to have Sarah Woolfries as Clerk for all governor meetings and she is very skilled and organised.

At the meetings I am always asked to present a headteacher's report. It includes information under the Ofsted headings; Effectiveness of leadership and management, Quality teaching and learning, Personal development, behaviour and welfare, outcomes for learners and the effectiveness of early years. I also reference our strengths and areas for development. Of particular interest to governors this week was an update on the build programme.

The role of the governors is to challenge through critical questioning all aspects of school life, to ensure we are moving forward and children are receiving the best education possible and to keep me to account on my roles and responsibilities.

Also during Wednesday's meeting we ratified the next year's budget and confirmed the structures for both schools. Unfortunately there is enormous pressure on our school budgets and we have to make savings in all areas but I am pleased to say we can balance our budgets this year. Next week we have the teaching and learning committee meeting that will focus specifically on the details of raising standards, curriculum development and Assessment.



Hope you all had a brilliant Easter holiday. It was wonderful to see so many of you at the Good Friday Easter Activities and a big thank you to Becky, Rev'd Cate and all the helpers. On Sunday there will be a joint Holy Communion Service at 11:00 in Feniton Church.
