Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents,

Congratulations to everyone as we complete another action packed year. Looking back at the key events it makes me feel very proud of all the children's achievements and as I listen to the staff planning for next year I am excited to think of what the children will get up to.

This week has included an Ofsted inspection for Awliscombe Primary School! It felt pretty brutal to receive the call in the last week of the year but everything has a silver lining. We passed with flying colours and the Inspector was very happy when he finished his one day inspection. The official report won't be out until September but we can leave this afternoon knowing it has been completed for another 3 years! I want to wish huge congratulations to everyone at Awliscombe, plus a special big well done to our own Mrs Morris who has done a fantastic job of Head of School.

A quick reminder that before you settle into your time off please check your child's hair. We have had a few cases of head lice. If we all tackle it in the holidays we could be nit free in September!!

The building is progressing really well. The track is laid this afternoon for the crane. The crane and classroom arrive on Monday. It will deliver the classroom in 3 pieces and then we will have two new classrooms on the go. The roof trusts are on and we are going to be water tight very soon.

7th September will be very tight for the classroom on the main site. We may need to manage for the first couple of days but Willow Class will be ready.

If there is any news that changes any of those details I will send a text in the holidays but otherwise enjoy August and wait to see the finished rooms.

Our year 6 are ready and eager for their new adventure. They have all actively served the school with passion and enthusiasm. They will be sorely missed but I will watch them continue to thrive and achieve from a distance and remember the good times we had at Payhembury.
