## Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents

We are only 1 more week away from the SATs for Year 2 and 6. While testing children at this young age has been a contentious subject we cannot avoid the inevitable each year. I am very proud of the efforts being demonstrated by the children to ensure they are fully prepared for what lies ahead for them. Year 6 SATs take place on the 8<sup>th</sup> -11<sup>th</sup> May and only happen in the mornings. Monday and Tuesday are English papers and Wednesday and Thursday are the Maths papers. The tests are carried out under strict exam conditions and we have to remove every possible learning aid from the display boards and the classrooms. We can be inspected at any point from 8am on Monday morning till Thursday afternoon to see if we are storing the papers properly; carrying out the tests correctly and checking there are no prompts around to support the children. Once the tests are complete they are put into sealed envelopes and are picked up by courier every afternoon. The results won't be available until 4<sup>th</sup> July. After the tests have been sent off we then have to make teacher assessments of the children's attainment and these are also sent to the testing agency working on behalf of the Department of Education to be scrutinised and compared to the test results. Both sets of results are then published in October as the school data for achievement and progress.

Year 2 SATS are different in a number of ways. All marking of test papers are done on site and by our own teachers. All workbooks are moderated by an external inspector who will come to school and look through every book to see whether they agree with our teacher assessments. They regularly require further evidence within a two week period after the visit to confirm agreed attainment levels for children if we can't agree on the day. KS1 SATS can take place throughout the whole of this half of term. They are not subjected to a fixed timetable, unlike KS2 who have no flexibility in the administration of the tests.

This week I accompanied the year 5 and 6 Tag Rugby team to The Kings, to the East Devon Finals. They worked incredibly hard as a team but unfortunately we didn't finish in the top three.

Don't forget May Day on Monday, please come along and support the event. It's always a lovely day and the children's dancing is such a joy. The more children we have dancing the better it gets. It starts at 11am for the crowning of the May King and Queen.

We had hoped to appoint a new meal time assistant last week but unfortunately it wasn't possible. So we still need an MTA at lunchtimes. Please come and see me if you might be interested or perhaps you know someone in the village who might like an hour a day.

Just a reminder that Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> May is polling day and we aren't able to use the village Hall. The children will still be able to have a hot meal but they will have a bag meal instead. Breakfast club will be over in the main school building on this day.

Also on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> May we are having a visit and an assembly from Sophie Whitlock. She will be promoting a new National ECB initiative called "All Stars Cricket". All Stars Cricket is for 5-8 year olds and introduces them to cricket in a fun, safe and friendly environment. They will be running the sessions at Kentisbeare CC which start on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> June from 6-7pm and this will run for 8 weeks.

On Friday we will be having a visit from Brad Murray, our primary Advisor. He will be observing the teachers and working alongside Mr Bladon and myself on school improvement.

Finally just to point out that a few changes in the school menu have been made. Copies of the new menu will be sent home next week so please have a read and see what you think.

Have a lovely bank holiday weekend and hopefully see you on Monday.
