Governors

In order to keep up to date with developments in the field of education, a huge amount of reading is needed as part of the role of being a governor. The governing body is kept extremely well informed by the clerk who receives regular updates from the likes of Babcock which highlights key news and reports from the Department for Education, Ofsted and Her Majesty's Chief Inspector (HMCI). Amongst recent articles was one highlighting some of the challenges facing the governance system in the UK which is made up of 300,000 volunteers who come from a range of backgrounds, not purely educational, and hence have mixed experience and understanding of the education system when they join governing bodies. The article pointed out that the education system has become increasingly complex in recent years and the demands on and expectations of governors in holding school leaders to account places ever greater demands on them. This really highlights the importance of educational experience within the governing body so as to be able to understand the practical challenges facing teachers and school leaders and hence to effectively challenge them on the ways in which they continually seek to improve the educational outcomes for pupils in the nation's schools. As someone with a professional background outside the sphere of education, I am very comforted by the clear capabilities in education of many of the members of the governing body of the FORT Federation, however such is the diversity of the skills required to run any school, those of us with skills outside education are also important. In order to ensure that, as a body, we have all the necessary skills a periodic skills audit is carried out to check and highlight any potential gaps so that any training needs can be identified and where relevant, new appointments to the governing body can target those whose skills would fill those gaps. In the meantime many hours of reading helps to fill some of the gaps and if you, like me, are interested to further your knowledge in this area then the publications pages of the gov.uk website provides access to many interesting papers on the whole sphere of education.
