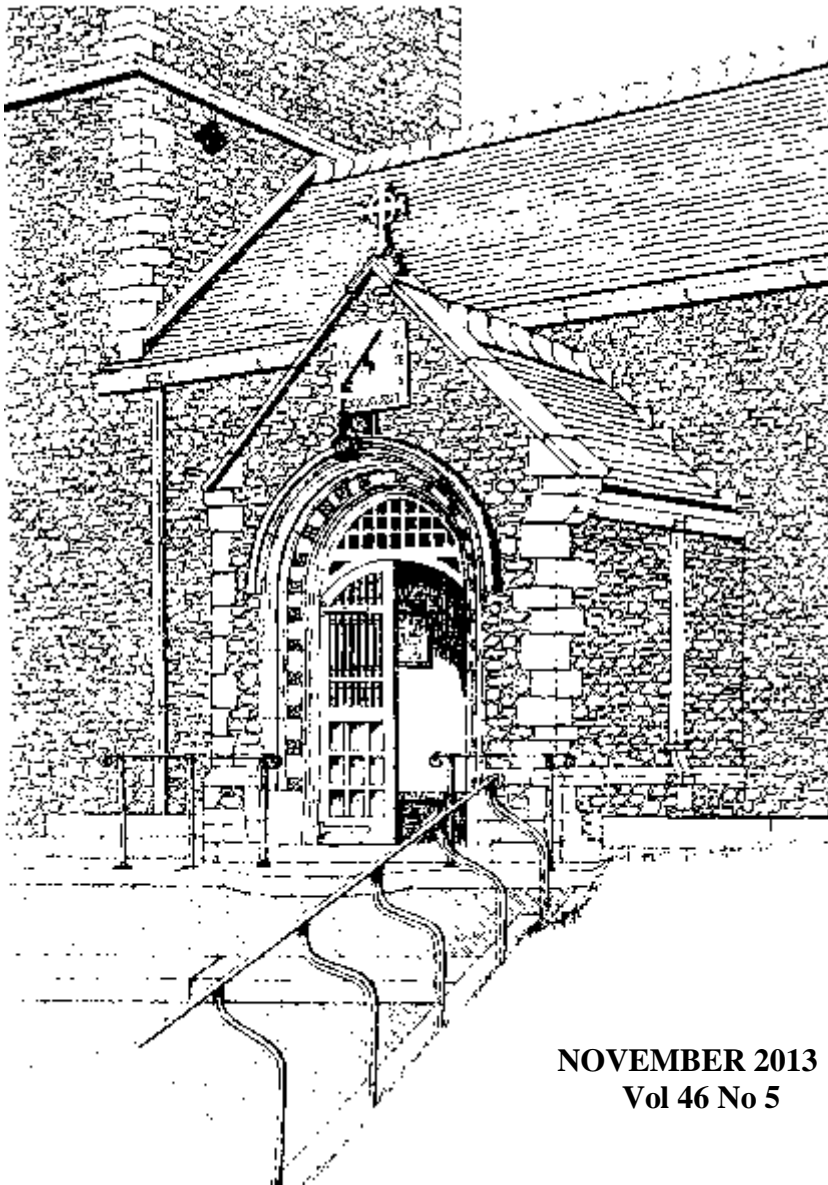

I am sure that this is not the only time of the year when we do this but this is a formal time for us to remember. A collective time, when we come together as a community, regardless of our particular faith or belief system and pause to remember. Differences and disagreements are put aside for a short time and there is an air of calm and peace. Wouldn't it be wonderful if that lasted longer than the two minutes silence, the time it takes for a candle to burn or the short services in church?

We may feel that there is little we can do to bring about peace around the world, that is true, but what about peace in our lives in our own hearts? Easier



said than done I am aware, but if we can try with ourselves there is a ripple effect which reaches out to others. We may not always agree with

those around us, there may be irritations, large or small, but the way they are handled can make a difference to that sense of peace and harmony.

We talk frequently about this approach to our children in school but do with listen ourselves; do we "practice what we preach"? This year, as we pause for silence, as we remember, let's also think about working for peace in our hearts and see what ripple effect that may have.

due to no volunteer being available - the
first time in the years since the shop
opened.**

Suggestions have been made such as reducing opening hours, but this would be difficult in practice as the early start is needed for newspapers, closing lunchtime would not be worth it as someone still has to close/open the shop and to close early would mean those who work all day might not be able to get their newspapers, pint of milk, bottle of wine - all those last minute needs. The committee is keen to keep the hours as user-friendly as possible.

If Payhembury wants to keep its community shop as it is then the community needs to help out. WE NEED MORE VOLUNTEERS

Just look at your day and see where you think you could work (even for an hour) in the shop - every little helps. We have volunteers who work, run businesses, have small children - they manage to spare a little time for the shop, so please consider whether you could too.

Some might worry about the till etc; this is quite easy once you get used to it and new volunteers will work alongside experienced ones until they are confident. Anyone who would like to work with a friend is very welcome - we have volunteers now who like to work with someone else. You do not need to commit to a particular time or day, just fill in gaps on the rota each week when you know you are free.

New Community Theatre Project The Music of Time

Tale Valley Community Theatre's new production will be performed in Payhembury Hall at 7.30pm on Wednesday 27th - Saturday 30th November at 7.30pm.

Created by twelve local playwrights, ranging in age from twelve to seventy three, following writing workshops in the Spring, the production deals with certain themes – agriculture, family life, transport, technology etc with short scenes on each from the 1940s (the childhood of the older participants) and the 2080s (the old age of the younger ones). Thus



we look back to what was and also forward to what may be. People from a wide range of parishes are taking part. The production features original music and lyrics (Charles West and Nick Pruce) with a choir and a soloist (Nick Lear) and all scenery is created with projected images (Tim Woolgar).



Scenes have been shared amongst eleven directors

in line with TVCT's aim to spread the skills of theatre making in the community.

On the 16th October we held our meeting in Payhembury Parish Hall with ten members present. Apologies were received from three members.

Mary extended a warm welcome to members and our speaker, Rosemary Stapley. Following an hymn and our prayers, our thoughts were with Ida, one of our members who is recovering at home following an operation and Mary's son who is in hospital. Overseas box collections were made.

Members were asked if they wished to participate in the Christmas Tree Exhibition in Payhembury's parish Church in December and all agreed that we should take part. The committee are considering changing the venue for winter meetings in Feniton to a warmer hall. This will be looked into.

Leader Paula then gave members notices which included the date for the Cathedral Carol Service, which will be at 12 noon on 6th December.

Our Speaker from Newfrontiers (Commission-together), Rosemary Stapley, then gave us a most interesting, if somewhat concerning, talk about the care of the elderly in India. Rosemary started off working in Mumbai with those suffering from leprosy and later worked in the slums. We were told that Psalm 113 is very relevant. A sincere vote of thanks was given and the meeting closed after tea and biscuits were enjoyed.

Our next meeting is in the Church at Feniton on 20th November, when Mrs Ann Pangbourne will be coming to speak to us about Israel and the roots of our faith.

Nature Notes *Observations from September*

Hello there

I'm writing these notes on 20th Oct—yes I know I nearly missed the Parish Paper!

The weather today has been very mixed—a terrific thunderstorm this morning followed by a nice sunny afternoon. It has been warm and very muggy recently. However, we're now into Autumn and this brings a change to our flora and fauna.

When I wrote the September notes, we were still experiencing nice warm sunny days, which brought out lots of butterflies. There were lovely red admirals, tortoiseshells and commas, plus white in our garden. One day I was amazed to see a very good specimen of a painted lady butterfly there too. It was the only one of these I've seen this

year. A few years ago, thousands of them flew into Britain from North Africa on the strong warm southerly winds.



Those warm sunny days have largely gone now and we have had some quite cold windy days. This change has brought in more birds to our bird table. Lots of tits, finches and sparrows. There were four house sparrows taking a bath in the bird bath at the same time! More blackbirds are feeding

on the windfall apples and there is more bird song—particularly from the robins—on 12th Oct (a nice day) there were still some butterflies getting drunk on these apples too!

Today we went for a walk and a weasel ran across the road just in front of us. I never cease to be amazed how tiny they are—but very fast—blink and you've missed them.

PAYHEMBURY PRIMARY SCHOOL

We have had a really smooth start to the new school year. All the children have moved up to their new classes with ease and confidence and the children all look comfortable and settled. The teachers have commented on their calm and positive attitudes.

There has been a lot of work going on around the school since our return from the summer holidays. New slate tiles have been put on the old building and all old asbestos tiles have been removed. During the holidays we had new insulation put into the roof and it has been treated for woodworm. The chimneys

have been repointed and the guttering replaced where necessary

In September the school went to Awliscombe Primary School to watch the Tour of Britain. The actual race was very exciting and before the race some of the children took part in football matches, cheered on by the other children.

There have been lots of sporting events for the children at The Kings School, including netball and multi skills events. Cameron Bryson took part in a Cross Country event and he came second overall. This was a huge achievement and what a wonderful ambassador for our school.

On European Language Day the children thoroughly enjoyed the visit from Monsieur Mahdjoub. He brought a group of students from Kings to perform a French story through drama. Another successful club that has taken off this term is the Spanish club at lunch time with Madame Shackleton.

The school had a visit from the EWO (Education Welfare Officer). There has been a significant drive from central government to monitor attendance in schools more closely. We are being asked to produce detailed statistics on our school, year group by year group and with the recent change in unauthorised attendance.

FOPS are in the process of producing a calendar to sell this year which will include all the children. The children had their photos taken for the month they were born and the calendar will go on sale towards the end of the term.

The whole school went to @ Bristol in October and it really was a very exciting trip to the museum. Having listened to the children recount their day, it was obvious that they had a fantastic time and learnt lots at the same time. Oak class were also lucky to go to The Norman Lockyer Observatory in Sidmouth as well.

Rev. Cate set up a 'Harvest Festival Experience' in the church and all the children had the opportunity to spend time exploring the church and completing the quiz. The visit was organised into different activities which the children rotated around. It was a huge success and the children were inspired by the whole experience.
