#### Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents,

The big jump takes place on Monday! We have parents taking part in an incredible record breaking parachute jump from Dunkerswell. I would like to wish them all the best and thank them all as the money raised is being given to FOPS.

On Wednesday evening I accompanied a group of 11 children to Exeter Cathedral to take part in a large celebration singing concert with the East Devon primary schools and the Cathedral school choir. It was such a privilege and an honour for the children to perform in that amazing space. They sounded beautiful. I was definitely a very proud headteacher.

On Thursday both our schools took part in a celebration service at St. Pauls Church in Honiton and again their behaviour and participation was impeccable.

Well done this week to all our year 1 children who have taken their phonics screening test and a special well done to Matthew who had super results in his phonics test.

Next week is a very full week. Monday morning starts with moderation for foundation stage teachers across both schools. Mrs Palmer and Mrs Dickson will work with the Early Years advisor, Julie Paddick to look at the children's work over the year and to ensure the teachers are assessing the children at the correct attainment. By the end of the session an agreed level for each individual child will be confirmed. Then that data is sent to the Department for Education.

On Tuesday our Year 4,5 and 6 children leave for their residential trip to Stoke Gabriel. It will be very quiet for four days in both schools. While Mr Bladon and Mrs Morris are away I will be available to help or support in any way but Mrs Kingscott/Mrs Palmer will be Deputising for Heads of School. Swimming continues for Willow and Ash classes on Monday but there will be no swimming on Wednesday.

I will be showing potential candidates around on Wednesday. We have lots of interest for our current job adverts.

On Thursday Miss Stoneman will have external moderations of her KS1 children assessments. This will take half a day and the external moderator is called Stephanie Burke. Again by the end of the session an agreed level for the children will be sent to the Department for Education.

On Friday our children return from the residential full of tales of adventure and campfire songs. I'm praying for better weather next week so they can really enjoy the outside camp!


On Sunday at 9:30 there will be a Parish Communion Service and at 6:00 there is Worship and Praise at Feniton Church, all very welcome.
