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As well as contributing to activities taking place in schools, the Science Festival is running events in Sidmouth and at the Norman Lockyer Observatory, including a free inter-active science trail along the Sea Front on Sunday 8 October. Just turn up between 11am - 3pm. Have a go at rock pooling or pulling the Lifeboat tractor.

FREE DAY OUT! Super Science Saturday is on 14 October when there will be fun hands-on experiments and activities such as making a volcano, popping candy, thermal imaging, jelly baby wave machine and a Drone race. These are at All Saints' Hall, Kennaway House, the Leigh Browne Room, the Methodist Church Hall, the Masonic Hall, Twyford House, the Parish Church and Sidmouth Museum. These events run from 11am until 5pm (approx) and are FREE! Please look for the Science Festival flags and dinosaur footprints and don't forget to collect a dinosaur stamp at each of these venues to be entered into a prize draw.

On 15 October the Science Festival moves to the Norman Lockyer Observatory for a Sunday Funday on "The Sky's the Limit", from 11am to 4pm. This costs £8 for adults but children are free.

There will be storytelling, planetarium shows, the Space Detectives with a virtual reality visit to space, robots, Minecraft and Scratch coding with 2.TimesDo, the now famous jet car races and lots of pre-school science fun. And we're launching a weather balloon if the weather is ok.

Don't forget to go to Kennaway House on Thursday, Friday or Saturday to see the science art work! Vote for your favourite and see which class has won a prize.

During the week there are events for Mums and Dads too, and Grans and Grandads: a Fungus Foray, lots of interesting talks and an evening about Infinity... which could go on a bit!
